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QV Café

The QV Café serves breakfast and lunch daily at all Quaker Valley schools. For the 2017-2018 school year, breakfast is \$1.50 and lunch is \$2.90 per day. Premium meals are offered at the middle and high schools for \$3.75. A meal includes an entree (usually grain and protein), choice of two fruits (juice is available as a fruit), choice of two vegetables and choice of milk. Bottled water is available for purchase at \$.85/\$1.00 or students can fill up reusable bottles from the water cooler in the café at no charge. *Federal regulations do not include water as a beverage choice with a meal.

If students do not take a combination of at least three of the five food groups, they will be charged the á la carte entree price of \$3.00 or the premium á la carte entree price of \$3.85.

Quaker Valley offers free and reduced price meals to students who qualify under state guidelines. Parents may obtain an application at any school office, at www.qvsd.org, or apply online at www.compass.state.pa.us. Participants must reapply each year.

The QV Café uses a computerized system for meal purchases at all four Quaker Valley schools, which allows parents to pay in advance for meals and/or a la carte items, but students can still pay daily with cash. Parents can make deposits either electronically by visiting www.MySchoolBucks.com or by check. Checks – made payable to "QV Café" – are collected at each school cafeteria or can be mailed to the district office. Attendance

Regular school attendance is required by law and is essential to student academic performance. The Pennsylvania School Code of 1949 allows for 10 absences. Students may be excused from school for the following reasons only:

- Illness
- Quarantine
- Death in the family
- Court appearances
- Family emergencies
- Essential health care
- Observance of religious holidays
- Approved educational trips
- Impassable roads
- Public disasters

All other absences are considered unexcused. After three unexcused absences, a notification letter will be sent home reminding parents of this policy. Participation in after-school activities and athletics is dependent upon student attendance on the day of the specific activity or sport.

Parents are asked to contact the school on any day their child is absent. If the parent does not call, the principal or his/her designee will call to confirm the absence.

Family vacations do not qualify as educational trips and shall be recorded as unexcused absences. Educational trips shall be approved only when there is a clear relationship to the curriculum and when the principal, in consultation with the student's teacher(s), certifies the assignments provided and means for the evaluation of the student's work.

Transportation Tips

- Arrive at the bus stop 10 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival
- Wait for the bus in a safe place – well off the roadway
- Enter the bus in an orderly manner and promptly take a seat
- Follow the bus driver's instructions
- Remain in the seat while the bus is in motion
- Keep head and arms inside the bus at all times
- Keep the aisles clear at all times
- Be courteous to the driver and other passengers
- Be alert to traffic when exiting the bus
- Pets and other animals are not permitted on buses, except for service animals
- Projects/instruments too large for a student's lap are not permitted

Parents requesting permission for their student to ride a bus other than the assigned bus must provide advance written permission to the school's administrative assistant. Such requests are to be made for emergency situations only.

Quaker Valley School District School Resource Officer Aaron Vanatta works to provide safety among all QV buildings while incorporating educational programs to educate and mentor students about safety in a friendly environment. News from the School Nurse

All medications, including over the counter medications, must be accompanied by a medication form, available at www.qvdsd.org. The form must be signed by the prescribing physician and the parent. Medications will not be given without the form and the two signatures. Quaker Valley's medication procedure is available at www.qvdsd.org. **Quaker Valley school nurses will be available in their buildings on Friday, August 18, from 9 a.m.-12 p.m.** for parents who would like to bring their child's medication to school. Our nurses believe this will help alleviate problems on the first day

New PA School Immunization Requirements 2017-2018

Starting August 1, 2017, the Pennsylvania Department of Health is changing school immunization requirements. Every child must have the required vaccines or they will risk exclusion from school. Under the new regulation, the current provisional waiver of eight months for school children to be fully immunized is reduced to five school days. Dental Health Requirements: Kindergarten & 3rd grade

The PA Department of Health guidelines require all students going into Kindergarten and 3rd grade to have a dental examination. Please have your child's dentist complete this form and return it to the Osborne Elementary School nurse by September 1. If you do not have private family dental insurance, the school's dentist can perform this screening. Please contact the Osborne Nurse at 412-749-4008.

Students going into Kindergarten are required to have a physical exam. Please submit your child's physical exam and immunization records to the Edgeworth Elementary School nurse as soon as possible.
